

Französische Zeitungen verklagen X: Kampf um faire Entlohnung!

Mehrere französische Zeitungen, darunter Le Monde und Le Figaro, klagen gegen X (ehemals Twitter) wegen unzulässiger Inhaltsnutzung.

Paris, Frankreich - In a dramatic showdown, major French newspapers have launched a fierce legal battle against Elon Musk's social media platform, X, formerly known as Twitter. The media giants, including Le Monde, Le Figaro, and Les Echos, are accusing X of shamelessly using their content without compensation, igniting a firestorm of controversy in the digital landscape.
