

## **Explosion in Kosovo: Wasserknappheit bedroht Stromversorgung des Landes!**

Kosovos PM Albin Kurti beschuldigt Serbien eines Terroranschlags, der die Wasserversorgung für Kraftwerke unterbrach.

### **Zubin Potok, Kosovo -**

Explosion threatens Kosovo's power supply as tensions with Serbia escalate!

In a shocking turn of events, an explosion has rocked a vital canal in Kosovo, crucial for supplying water to two power plants that generate the lion's share of the nation's electricity. The blast, which occurred near Zubin Potok—just 16 kilometers from the Serbian border—has cut off essential water flow, raising alarms that much of Kosovo could face a blackout by the weekend. Prime Minister Albin Kurti has not held back, labeling the incident a „terrorist attack“ orchestrated by Serbia, claiming it was executed by „professionals“ from „gangs“ aimed at crippling Kosovo's critical infrastructure.

Local media reports reveal that the explosion involved an explosive device thrown into the canal, damaging a bridge wall and causing significant water leakage. Faruk Mujka, head of the water company Iber Lepenci, confirmed the dire situation, stating that the water supply must be halted immediately to address the issue, which directly impacts the Kosovo Energy Corporation (KEK), the main power provider in the country. Fortunately, there have been no immediate reports of injuries, but the urgency of the situation cannot be overstated.

# International Reactions and Rising Tensions

The United States embassy in Pristina has condemned the „criminal attack,“ pledging full support to the Kosovo government in identifying those responsible. Meanwhile, Aivo Orav, the EU ambassador to Kosovo, highlighted the gravity of the situation, noting that the attack is already „depriving considerable parts of Kosovo from water supply.“ This incident comes on the heels of increased security measures by Kosovo police following recent grenade attacks on a police station and a municipality building in the northern region, where ethnic Serbs reside. The connection between these incidents remains unclear, but the atmosphere is charged with tension as Kosovo grapples with its complex relationship with Serbia, particularly in the north, where the Serb minority continues to reject Kosovo’s independence.
